

# When Is the Cheapest Time to Book a Alaska Flight?

The cheapest time to book a Alaska flight is when you are in the optimal advance booking window for your route and travel season – not a specific time of day or day of the week. For domestic travel, this window is generally 3 to 6 weeks before departure. For international peak travel, it is 3 to 5 months out. ## The Three Timing Dimensions That Determine Alaska Fare Levels

**Dimension 1 – Advance Booking Window** How far in advance you buy relative to your travel date is the strongest fare determinant. The relationship between advance booking and price follows a U-shaped curve on most routes: fares start moderate at window opening, often become most competitive in the mid-range window (3 to 6 weeks domestic, 2 to 4 months international for peak), then rise sharply in the final 2 weeks before departure as last-minute demand pricing activates.

The mid-range window represents the intersection of two pressures: early fares set before competitive discounting has fully occurred, and late fares set after last-minute demand has thinned inventory. This mid-range window is where the best combination of price and seat availability typically exists.

**Dimension 2 – Travel Season** The time of year you are traveling matters enormously. January and February domestic fares (excluding MLK weekend and Presidents' Day) are typically the lowest of the year. June, July, and August command premium prices on most leisure routes. September and October offer excellent value. Holiday periods – Thanksgiving week, Christmas week, New Year's – are the most expensive individual periods regardless of advance booking.

For international travel, the seasonal pattern is similar but more pronounced. A transatlantic fare in January can be 40 to 60 percent lower than the same route in July. Booking the right travel season is a more powerful lever than any booking timing strategy.

**Dimension 3 – Travel Day** The day of the week you fly affects your fare significantly on domestic routes. Tuesday and Wednesday departures are 15 to 35 percent cheaper than Friday and Sunday. For families and travelers with schedule flexibility, shifting departure from Friday to Wednesday captures meaningful savings – often more than any booking timing optimization.

## What Time of Day Is Cheapest to Buy Alaska Flights?

No specific time of day consistently produces lower Alaska fares in 2026. Fares update throughout the day based on algorithm signals, and a price that looks low at 9 AM may be higher by noon and lower again by 7 PM. The continuous nature of Alaska's pricing system means that checking at a specific time of day is no more reliable than checking at any other time.

What is more reliable than time-of-day checking is fare alert monitoring. Setting a fare alert in the Alaska app for your specific route notifies you when the price drops below your target without requiring you to check at specific intervals. The notification comes to you rather than requiring you to be in the right place at the right time.

## Practical Application " A Season-by-Season Guide

**For January and February travel:** Book 3 to 5 weeks before departure. Post-holiday demand is soft and fares are naturally low. Waiting longer into the 2-week window does not typically produce meaningful additional savings and risks better seat availability going to earlier bookers.

**For spring break travel (mid-March to mid-April):** Book 2 to 3 months in advance. Spring break travel demand is predictable and strong " fares rise significantly as the break period approaches and do not come back down before departure.

**For summer travel (June through August):** Book 3 to 5 months in advance for international, 4 to 8 weeks for domestic. International summer fares can be booked effectively in the February to April window. Domestic summer fares are more volatile and the mid-booking window (4 to 8 weeks out) often captures competitive pricing.

**For fall travel (September and October):** Book 3 to 6 weeks before departure for domestic, 2 to 3 months for international. Shoulder season demand is moderate and fares are competitive throughout a longer booking window.

**For Thanksgiving travel:** Book 3 to 4 months in advance " Thanksgiving is one of the most reliably sold-out periods in domestic aviation and fares do not drop before the holiday.

**For Christmas and New Year's travel:** Book as soon as plans are confirmed " 4 to 5 months in advance for the best selection of times and prices. The best Christmas travel options disappear earliest.

## Frequently Asked Questions
