

What Is the Cheapest Month to Book a Alaska Flight?

The cheapest months to fly Alaska are January and February for most domestic and international routes — post-holiday demand drops significantly and airlines compete aggressively for passengers with pricing well below peak levels. Call 📞 **(+1 (855)32432.94)** with your destination and travel flexibility and ask the agent to compare fares across different months so you can see the actual dollar difference for your specific route. Understanding the seasonal fare pattern before you plan your trip allows you to choose travel dates that produce genuine savings rather than discovering the price difference after your dates are already set.

The Seasonal Fare Calendar — Month by Month

January is consistently the cheapest month to fly Alaska on most domestic and many international routes. After the Christmas and New Year's holiday surge ends in the first week of January, demand drops sharply and airlines respond with competitive pricing. The post-holiday low often lasts through mid-February. This is the best time of year to find genuinely low fares on routes that command premium prices for the rest of the year.

February (excluding Presidents' Day weekend) maintains the January pricing pattern for most routes. Some ski destination routes see elevated pricing in February due to peak ski season demand, but general leisure routes and business routes are at annual lows. Valentine's Day travel to romantic destinations — New York, Paris, Hawaii — is an exception within February pricing.

March splits based on spring break timing. The weeks adjacent to spring break are moderately priced, while spring break weeks themselves command premium pricing comparable to summer peaks on family leisure routes. Booking March travel carefully around the spring break window captures good value; booking during spring break means paying peak prices.

April is a transition month — the first half often has good pricing as spring break demand subsides, and the second half begins to see early summer demand building. International travel to Europe in April is a particularly strong value proposition — good weather, lower prices than May or June, and fewer crowds.

May begins the summer ramp-up. International fares to Europe increase noticeably from April to May. Domestic fares begin to reflect Memorial Day weekend demand toward the end of the month. Early May still offers good value; late May becomes expensive.

June, July, and August are the most expensive months on most Alaska leisure routes. Summer demand is at its peak for both domestic beach and theme park routes and international European

destinations. Business routes see some mid-week relief but are generally more expensive than off-peak months overall.

September and October offer some of the best value of any time of year – fares are substantially below summer peaks, travel conditions are often excellent, and airports and destinations are less crowded. International travel to Europe in September and October is particularly strong on a value-to-experience basis.

November splits between a moderate first half and expensive Thanksgiving week. The first two weeks of November are often very good for domestic travel – soft demand and competitive pricing. Thanksgiving week is among the most expensive individual travel periods of the year.

December follows the same pattern – moderate pricing in early December followed by premium holiday pricing for Christmas week and the New Year period. The week between Christmas and New Year's is one of the most expensive travel windows of the year.

Cheapest Months for Specific Trip Types

International Europe: September and October offer the best value combination – lower prices than summer, better weather than winter, fewer crowds. January and February are cheapest in absolute terms but winter conditions limit some activities.

Domestic Beach (Florida, Hawaii, Caribbean): January and February represent the best value precisely because demand is high but airlines are competing for leisure travelers who can escape winter. Shoulder pricing appears in May and September through early November.

Business Routes: January and February still produce lower pricing even on business-dominant routes where mid-week travel year-round has some pricing benefit. The holiday demand that drives December and November prices on leisure routes affects business routes less, but the post-holiday drop is still significant.

Ski Destinations: December and January peak ski season pricing is highest regardless of the general seasonal pattern. March sometimes offers a shoulder-season ski pricing window as the season winds down.

The Cheapest Month to Book vs. the Cheapest Month to Travel

Clarifying the distinction between these two questions helps you apply the seasonal insight correctly.

The cheapest month to travel means which calendar month produces the lowest fares for the flights themselves – January and February for most routes.

The cheapest month to book means during which month you should make your purchase to get the best price for your specific travel dates. This depends entirely on when you are traveling and follows the advance booking window logic rather than the seasonal calendar:

If you are traveling in June, book in February or March for the best pre-peak pricing. If you are traveling in September, book in June or July. If you are traveling in January, book in November or December for the prior year " or even in December of the travel year if you can find flexibility.

When should I book summer Alaska flights to get a decent price? International summer fares are best captured in the February to April window before peak demand drives prices to summer highs.

Quick Reference: Alaska Seasonal Fare Guide

Cheapest months to fly: January, February " post-holiday, annual pricing lows.

Second-best value: September, October " excellent conditions, below-summer pricing.

Most expensive months: June, July, August – peak summer demand.

Most expensive periods: Thanksgiving week, Christmas week, New Year's.

Spring break: Book 2–3 months in advance – prices rise as break approaches.

Summer international: Book Feb–Apr for best pre-peak pricing on June–August travel.

Business routes: January, February still lower – holiday demand pattern less extreme.
